

Marsh Is Chosen As 'Talent For Service' Chairman In County

State College Scholarships Available to Students

Application materials for scholarships at North Carolina State College during the next academic year are being distributed this week for the use of high school seniors throughout the State.

In reporting this, Dr. Ralph Fadam, chairman of the college's Scholarship and Student Aid Committee, and Dr. Lyle B. Rogers, student financial aid officer at the institution, also announced the list of county chairmen who will be in charge of screening scholarship applicants from their counties.

Robert S. Marsh has been named "Talent For Service" chairman for Chowan County.

Under the program, 25 to 30 awards, known as "Talent For Service" scholarships, are made each year to outstanding high school students who are interested in the field of study provided at State College.

The scholarships average \$2,000 in total value, usually amounting to \$500 per year for a four-year period. All applicants are considered not only for the "Talent For Service" scholarships but for various other awards.

The "Talent for Service" Committee in each county helps to distribute application materials to the various schools, accepts and screens the recommended applicants from each school, and forwards them to the college for final processing.

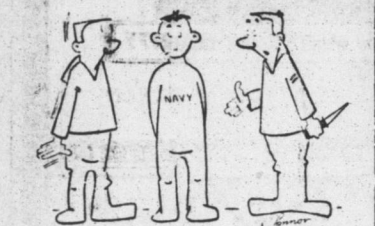
More than 600 applicants were handled in this way during the 1955-56 school year and nearly 200 awards of one kind or another were made to entering students.

Sunday School Lesson

LET NOT YOUR HEART BE TROUBLED

International Sunday School Lesson For December 2, 1956.

Memory Selection: "Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me."
—John 14:1.

Lesson Text: John 14:1-14.

Probably no Scripture passage in the entire Bible has been of as much comfort to Christians in sorrow as that given to us for our study this week. For that reason, it is probably one of the most loved portions of God's word, for most of us have, at one time or another,

needed the comfort it gives.

Gathered with his disciples in the Upper Room on the last night of his earthly life, Jesus had broken the bread and passed around the cup, thereby instituting what we have come to call the "Lord's Supper," a rite, through the observance of which, we are to keep in mind the life he lived and the death he died—for us. Jesus had already announced one would betray him, and that one would deny him. The disciples appeared dumb in their amazement and sorrow. In this crisis, Jesus begins to comfort and instruct them in the marvellously tender words recorded by John in the 14th, 15th and 16th chapter of his gospel. These words are Je-
