ly typed or written on all labels and Christmas cards. Use zone numbers, and it's a good idea to include an extra label inside packages.

Speaking about stamps, the Postmaster said, "Use three cent postage on all your Christmas cards. This way they will be delivered promptly, and forwarded or returned if necessary, providing you include your name and address on your Christmas card envelopes. First-Class postage on your Christmas cards enables you to include handwritten messages, thus making your Christmas greetings more

personal. By including your name and address on each Christmas card envelope, both you and your friends can keep your mailing lists up-to-date."

The Postmaster urges that you mail all of your out-of-town Christmas cards and packages immediately, and certainly not later than December 10th. Christmas mail for local addresses should be started on its way at least a week before Christmas.

**Vets' Question Box**

Q—Under the War Orphans Education program, may special restorative training be taken by a disabled young person on a part-time basis?  
A—No. Special restorative training must be full-time. However, VA will determine what constitutes full-time training, based on the capacities of the individual.  
Q—My husband died on active

duty, and I am drawing monthly Servicemen's Indemnity payments. After December 31, 1956, will I be allowed to continue drawing these payments, along with Indemnity Compensation payments under the

new Survivors Benefits Act. No. Indemnity Compensation under the new law is not payable unless you surrender your rights to Servicemen's Indemnity payments.

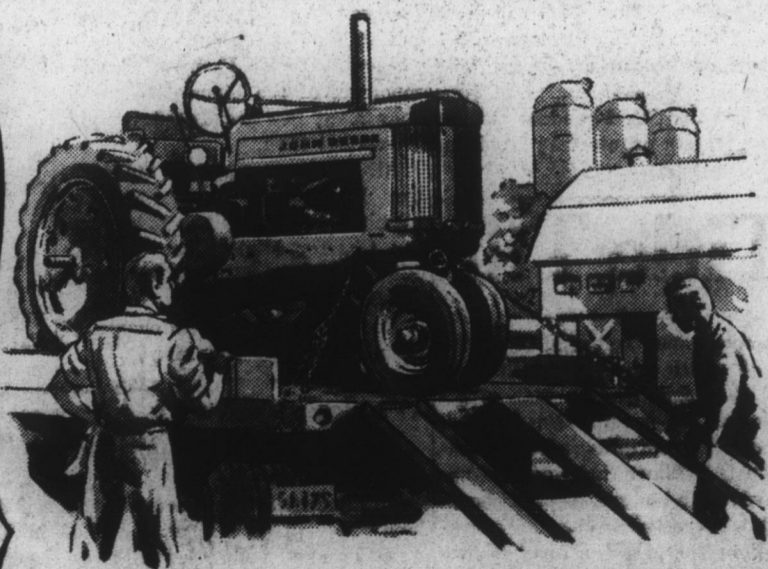

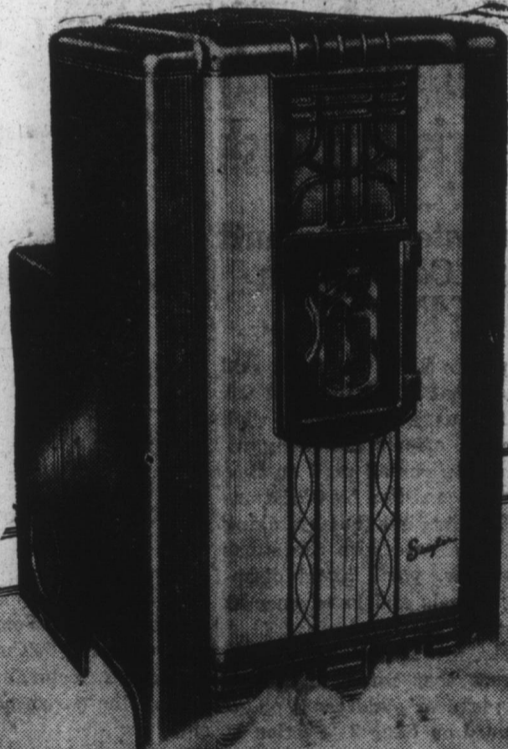

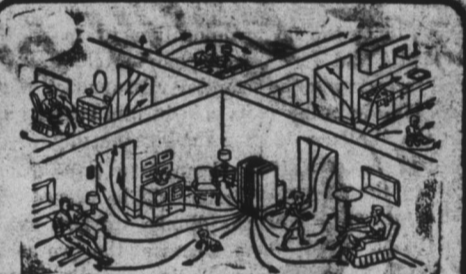
