Support Program For Soybeans Is Extended

The county ASC office has been advised that the 1956 Crop Price Support Program has been extended to cover soybeans grading lower than No. 4 if such grade has been given because the total damage exceeds 8 per cent, according to H. O. West, Chowan County ASC office manager. This change in the program was made necessary because of extensive damage to soybeans in the field brought about by excessive rainfall in recent weeks. Soybeans must grade No. 4 or better except for damage but must not contain in excess of 14 per cent moisture. A maximum of 3 per cent heat damage is permitted. The support rate for these soybeans will be discounted on the basis of total damage.

Farmers desiring additional information on the Soybean Price Support Program should contact the county ASC office, Mr. West said.
