## Tree Farm Program **Encourages Repeat**ed Tree Crops

The forest industries of North Carolina are adding over \$537,400,-000 annually to the state's wealth according to Carr Gibson of Lum berton, chairman of the North Carolina Forest Industries Committee

Gibson, whose committee spon-sors the industry-operated Tree Farm Program in North Carolina, said the Department of Commerce's newest Census of Manufacturers shows forest industries of the state in 1954 and \$331 million in value through manufacture, paid ou more than \$188 million in payroll and spent approximately \$18 million for capital improvements. The \$331 million value added

through manufacture represented an increase of over 41 per cent since 1947, Gibson said. North Carolina's forest indus-

the report shows, emplo nearly 74,000 persons. Forest in dustries in this state are those which manufacture lumber, furniture and fixtures, pulp, paper and other paper and wood products. The industry chairman said ex-

pansion of the Tree Farm program, which encourages private landowners to grow repeated tree crops through careful management and protection of their woodlands. will broaden the base of the state's vast forest economy.

North Carolina presently has mercial timberland enrolled in the industry-sponsored program grow timber as a crop.

A chest X-ray will be given anyone wishing it, along with the examination of the five areas of the body where cancer is most easily found and cured. There are no limitations as to sex, race, physical or economic status at the center, However, women should be 35 or more; men should be 40 or over unless referred by a doctor, or unless one of the "Seven Danger Signals" or "symptoms" are present.

Only 30 people can be seen at the Center each month due to limit. ed facilities, so it is suggested that anyone who wishes to be assured of an appointment should write the Cancer Center, Elizabeth City, for a priority. Examinees are asked to bring a robe or housecoat with them
