

Peanut Support Price Is Available Through Jan. 31st

Loan Prices Will Be Paid at Two Edenton Concerns

Peanut growers are reminded at in accordance with the regulations of the Commodity Credit Corporation loan prices are available on peanuts through January 31, 1957, according to Joe S. Sugg, Executive Secretary of the North Carolina Peanut Growers Association.

Mr. Sugg pointed out that the Peanut Cooperative Marketing Association is operating receiving points and buying the peanuts based on grade. He stated that it is most important for every farmer who is interested in receiving loan price on his peanuts through the top for them to be delivered at the receiving points prior January 31st.

Local receiving points are Edenton Peanut Company and the Albarable Peanut Company.

Sunday School Lesson

GOSPEL RIGHTEOUSNESS

International Sunday School Lesson For January 20, 1957.

Memory Selection: "For I say unto you, That except your righteousness shall exceed the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, ye shall in no case enter into the kingdom of heaven."

—Matthew 5:20.

Lesson Text:

Matthew 5:13-20, 43-48.

Three chapters in Matthew's gospel, in the form of a sermon by Jesus, make up what we know as the Sermon on the Mount. For our lesson this week, we have only a

part, but an important one, of this great discourse by our Lord.

While it is possible that this address may have been delivered at one time, the probability is that the author of Matthew's gospel collected extracts from numerous discourses, using them to make more complete the sermon delivered by Jesus to the Twelve immediately after they had been chosen by him.

Luke, in the sixth chapter of his gospel, reports a sermon of about thirty verses, against the one hundred and seven of Matthew. However, in other parts of Luke's gospel, there are about thirty-four other verses which correspond very closely to the utterances placed by Matthew in the Sermon on the Mount. **Continued on Page 5—Section 2**

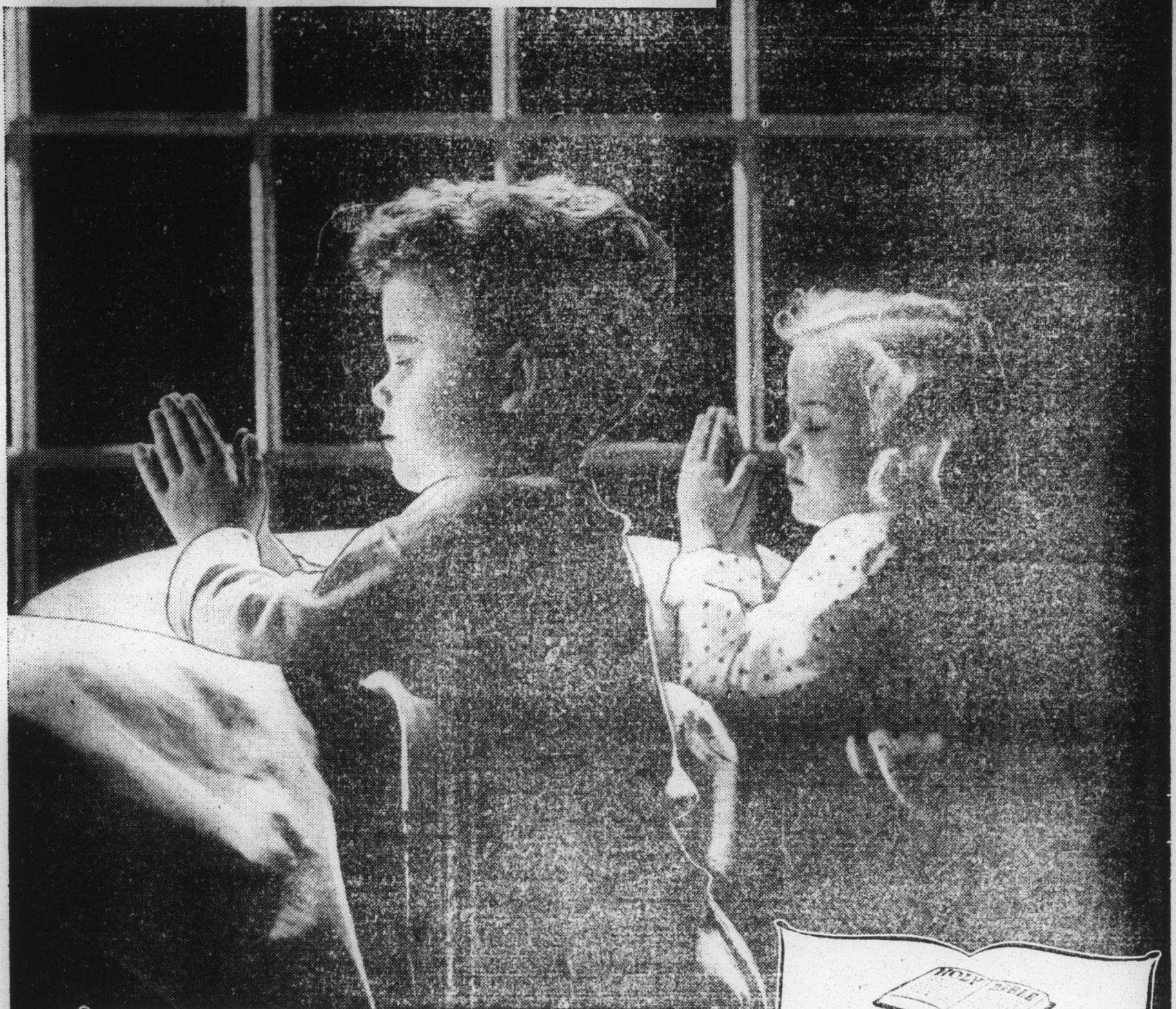
