

Paper Work Cut For Vet Patients

Specific Changes Are Made Under New System

Paper work will be cut for veteran-patients with service-connected disabilities that require long-term outpatient treatment, and for the "home town" doctors who treat them under Veterans Administration authorization.

VA said the new system of sharply reduced billings and forms went into effect January 1, 1957, in most areas.

In North Carolina and seven other states — California, Colorado, Michigan, Oregon, South Dakota, Washington, and Wisconsin — and in Hawaii the effective date will be July 1, 1957.

The simplified method involves individually selected long-term patients and their doctors, VA said. About 40,000 doctors and 637,000 veterans are participating in the program.

Specific changes to be made under the new system are:

1. Doctors caring for the selected chronic patients will receive authorization from VA to continue treatment for periods up to one year, instead of having to submit a monthly request to continue treatment as at present.

2. These doctors may submit reports to VA on the medical condition of patients at the end of three months instead of each month as at present. By cutting down on the frequency of reports, VA hopes doctors will have time to describe the medical condition of patients more fully.

3. These doctors may submit their monthly bills to a VA regional office or the individual doctor's letterhead stationery instead of on VA forms.

4. Certain veterans in the home-town program who must travel to cities near their homes to visit medical specialists will receive travel authorization to cover the entire authorized treatment period instead of monthly travel authorization as at present.

PARABLES OF THE KINGDOM

International Sunday School Lesson For February 17, 1957.

Memory Selection: "The Kingdom of Heaven is like unto a merchant man, seeking goodly pearls; who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had, and bought it."

—Matthew 13:45-46

Lesson Text: Matthew 13:31-35, 44-52.

In his teaching, Jesus spoke frequently of the "Kingdom of Heaven."

By word and analogy, he sought to acquaint his disciples with its nature, its method of origin and growth, and the desirability of its glorious advent. The term was used to refer both to the immediate acceptance of its principles by individuals and to the eventual inauguration of the golden era when all men were included. Sitting in a boat on Lake Gennesaret, Jesus presented the fundamentals of the Kingdom of Heaven in seven parables. Jesus began the use of parables in his teaching so that his hostile critics would be
