

**Projects Outlined  
By Club Women**

Chowan County Home Demonstration Club presidents were briefed on coming events and plans at a meeting in the home agents' office on Monday afternoon.

Club women were urged to encourage club members to read more books on the approved list. Recommendations for book review certificates must be submitted by October 1.

Tentative plans were announced for the club women to solicit membership for the Chowan County Farm Bureau in September. First, second, and third cash prizes are being offered by the sponsoring organization—prizes being \$15, \$10, and \$5, respectively. A "kick-off" dinner meeting will be held for those club members in charge of this drive, which will last one week, possibly September 9-13.

One woman from each local club is to help with the committee in charge of entries in the County Fair on Monday, October 7. Judging of exhibits will begin at 10 o'clock on Tuesday, October 8.

Consideration was given to a proposed project by the American Legion which has asked the cooperation of the clubs with that organization in sponsoring a county-wide entertainment at Hatteras.

Miss Morris reminded club presidents to call for leader reports, book reviews, and current events at their local meetings. She urged them to make sure their club was well represented at county-wide meetings of the organization.

Plans are under way for the annual Husbands' Supper-Achievement Day program to be held at Chowan Community Building in early November.

Clubs were congratulated by the same agent for the wonderful picnics being held this month. It was agreed that such events had been most successful with some clubs having the best attendance they have ever had.

**Local Firemen Answer Six Alarms In July**

Chief W. J. Yates reports that during July Edenton firemen answered six alarms, three in Edenton and three out of town. For the Edenton fires the firemen were out three hours and one hour and 15 minutes out of town. They were on the air 35 seconds in town and 40 seconds out of town. In town the firemen traveled four miles and 20 miles out of town.

In Edenton 900 feet of hose was laid and 450 feet out of town. Fifty volunteers responded for the Edenton fires and 66 for the rural alarms.

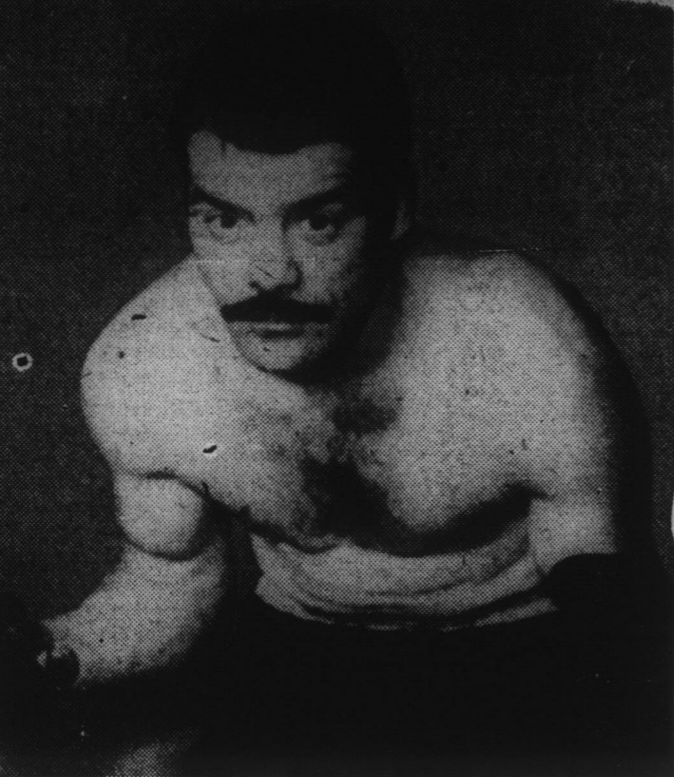
Property involved included \$122,500 in town and \$20,000 out of town. Damage was estimated at \$125 for the Edenton fires and none out of town. Insurance in town was \$105,000 and out of town, \$10,000.

The firemen held one fire drill and extended five courtesies. They washed gasoline off streets, filled three fire extinguishers, assisted in rescue work at a train wreck and provided stand-by pumper service for five hours at the U. S. Naval Auxiliary Air Station during water shut down.
