TIMBER-USING INDUSTRY CHANGING FAST IN N. C.

The timber-using industry in this state, as well as in other areas, is changing fast, according to experts in the field.

R. S. Douglass, forestry specialist for the N. C. Agricultural Extension Service at State College, says a good indication of the change is the attitude of sawmill operators toward land ownership and timber production.

Douglass says a few years ago practically no sawmill operators felt they could afford to own land and wait for a new crop of timber to grow. Now many of them have found it good business. Not only are they holding timber-producing land, they are carrying out good forestry practices to increase timber produc-

tion. Some of these practices, says Douglass, require the investment of sizeable sums of money that will be returned, with good interest in sawlogs 40 years from now. "These sawmill operators, like many North Carolina farmers, have found that investing in timber production pays good interest. The investment in young pines pays off," concludes Douglass.

during the evening, if some of these men become intoxicated and lose their senses. He is not responsible for those.

"But if he knows certain business associates are given to this vice, and are known to be heavy drinkers, he, as a Christian should deliberately avoid, and no doubt will, entertaining this man in his home, or at least making a close friend of him... because, if he did any of these things, he would (known to be a Christian) be telling the world more or less that this vice in this friend be considered of little consequence... It is one thing to be kind to a man who is a heavy drinker, with the hope of winning him to Christ, but it is an altogether different matter to take him into close social fellowship..."

Paul not only advises Christians to avoid close fellowship with evildoers in their daily lives, but he also declares that they should not be allowed to have the fellowship of the church. Dr. Charles R. Erdman says: "Possibly the time has come now for the Church to consider the discipline, not only of men guilty of the gross sins with which this section of the epistle especially deals but also of those who are 'greedy of gain,' and 'guilty of extortion.' Such action might cause some consternation in our complacent modern Church, but it might bring a stirring, surprising awakening message to an unbelieving world."

Probably no truth from this lesson needs to be stressed more in today's world than that of Christian purity. Everywhere one goes, practically everything one sees or hears is tainted with an over-emphasis on sex. However, a proper realization of the nature of our physical bodies will rule out all sexual sins. The conception that the body of the Christian is the temple of the Holy Spirit is one of the highest truths ever revealed to man. God, as the creator and owner of our bodies, and the dweller therein, deserves at our hands the very best efforts we can make to glorify him through them. A sin of sex is against the body in which God dwells. Therefore, the only al-

lowable principle for the Christian is clean, moral living.

In a day in which loose morals are rampant and the trend of the world is to blink at sin, it is time for us to give more attention to keeping the moral standards of our church members as high as Jesus Christ would have them to be.

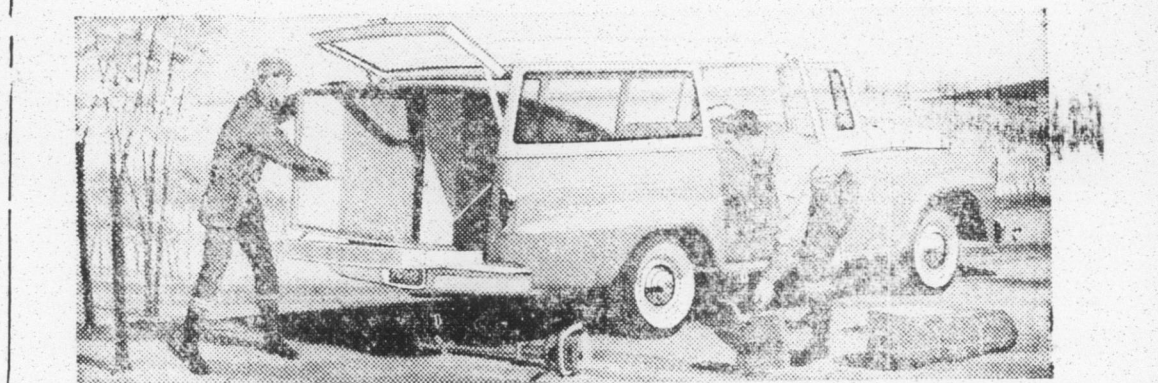
