The Aces had little difficulty in bowling over Weldon, the Roanoke-Chowan Conference champions, 40-13 in Ahoskie Monday night. The game was postponed from the previous Friday night due to a deluge of rain which covered practically the entire Ahoskie gridiron with water, causing the game to be called off.

The Aces proved to be a welloiled gridiron machine Monday night, playing heads-up football, charging hard, providing superb blocking, tackling fiercely, so that, except for a time in the first half, they completely outclassed the Weldon boys in every department of the game.
