This continued rat campaign is sponsored by the County Com-missioners in cooperation with and all dow S and all dow S State and local Health Departments.

The poison is free and can be secured at the Health Department 7th - 8th Graders

The Health Department points out that the mixture is a poison, but that instructions are given, with each package of bait, which should be read carefully and carried out. It also contains instructions for making a bait box which prevents domestic animals from getting to the poison.






