

### '57 Christmas | Christmas Club Seals In Mail Opens Monday

Ralph Parrish and Mrs. James Bond, co-chairmen of the Christters have been mailed this week, \$65,000. and that they earnestly hope these letters will receive careful consid-

"Every thinking person should stop to remember that there were 1,850 new cases of tuberculosis in North Carolina last year," the chairmen say, "and that 263 persons died of the disease."

Bringing it nearer home, there were five new cases in Chowan County last year and three new cases this year. At present there are seven persons in sanitoriums. The chairmen point out that the tragedy of tuberculosis is that so many people are exposed to it through unsuspected cases.

The National TB Association is working on a vaccine known as BCG to inoculate people against the disease and encouraging reports are coming in from the use of it, but much money is needed to perfect and manufacture enough for national use.

"Stop and consider what has happened to infantile paralysis as the result of research paid for by dimes given by men, women and children all over the nation," say the chairmen, "then send your money to the Christmas Seal
