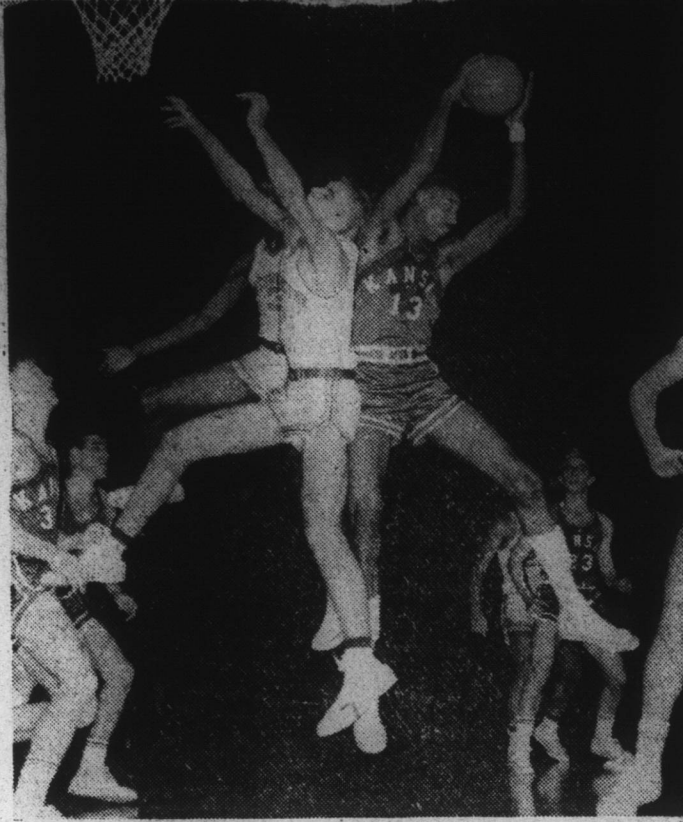
Gliden Club Has Christmas Party
