Mrs. Bessie B. Ramsey, Extension Subject Matter Specialist, Greensboro, spent a day with us last week. She was here primarily to attend the District Rural Health Conference, but we had a chance to check over work planned for this year in her field. She will be back in May to conduct a school with leaders on "Chair Bottoming." She will also conduct a Freezing Worship for project leaders in June.

We were pleased to see that leaders were present from ten of our thirteen neighborhoods at the Rural Health Conference. These leaders will give a report on the conference at club and community meetings, during January and February. Such subjects as Household Poisons, Farm Chemicals, Dental Care, Farm, Home and Community Sanitation will be discussed.

A total of 41 4-H Club officers, representing each club in the county, were present at Council meeting Saturday. Plans were made to have a county-wide meeting on March 9 in observance of National 4-H Club Week. Also each club's monthly program in March will be on 4-H Club work in the club, county and state. Each club will send a delegate either to 4-H Club Camp in July or to 4-H Club Week in June.

A general discussion was held on how to get more project work completed. An effort will be made to have 4-H leaders, have more home conferences, with both parents and 4-H Club members.

All home demonstration clubs in the county are having election this month. Officers elected will serve 1958 and 1959. Outgoing presidents are leaving these questions for each member to think about.

2. Do you try to be pleasant to your family and others around you?
3. Do you and your family have fun together at home?
4. Do you and your family plan
