Since the hog market has shifted in recent years from the lard to the meat type hog, it is very important for farmers to produce the kind of hogs which sell highest at the market. By attending this demonstration, farmers will become better informed about hog market situa-

tion. The demonstration should prove to be of great value to town people as well as farmers, as many town people wish to learn how to properly cut meat.

Swine entries at the Chowan Fat Stock Show and Sale this year are open to adult as well as to 4-H and FFA Club members. Every club member and adult farmer may have two entries in each of the following classes:

Class I—180 to 210 pounds. Pen of three or individual.

Class II—211 to 240 pounds. Pen or three or individual.

Adults will not compete with club members for prizes. A total of fifteen steers will be entered by Chowan County 4-H and FFA club members. The general public is invited to attend.

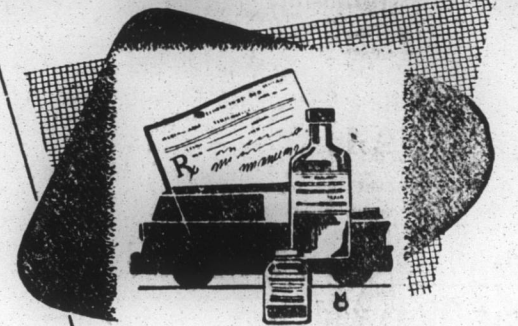
