SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

As Christians, we should constantly bear this in mind, and be guided by it in our daily contacts with those in our own community, church or un-churched. A constant example of Christianity in our everyday life will inevitably bring respect and admiration from the man who does not belong to any particular denomination, and, inevitably, the next step in his train of thought will

be... "So-and-so seems to get a lot out of his church and its activities... Maybe it has something to offer me." The seed has been planted, and from this point onward it is simply a matter of a little care and attention to bring it to fruition.

In studying our second text for today (Luke 10:1-2)—and the one from which our Memory Selection is made) we find Jesus sending seventy men ahead of him, to spread the word of the gospel, and to tell of his coming. This is the second step in evangelism on home ground; the territory is gradually being widened, and new ground is being sought for the sowing of the seeds of Christianity.

In I Thesalonians 1:6-10 we see that Paul discovered a missionary function in the response of the Thessalonian Christians to his preaching. The way in which they had "received the word in much affliction, with joy" (verse 6) had inspired others. Their "faith in God" (verse 8) had roused echoes in others. Their turning to God from idols had made a fixed impression on others. Thus we see, again, as explained earlier in this lesson, that living the Christian life may have its own evangelistic impact.

The good news of the gospel communicates itself more by attitudes than by words. This really good evangel knows, and he speaks out of warm, rich experience. No words can serve as a substitute for holy living. The evangel is a representative of both Christ and his church. Godly lives are the most effective

evangelistic messages.

The words of Jesus to his demonic still remain the best guide for us if we wish to be good witnesses. "Go home to your friends, and tell them how much the Lord has done for you, and how he has had mercy on you."

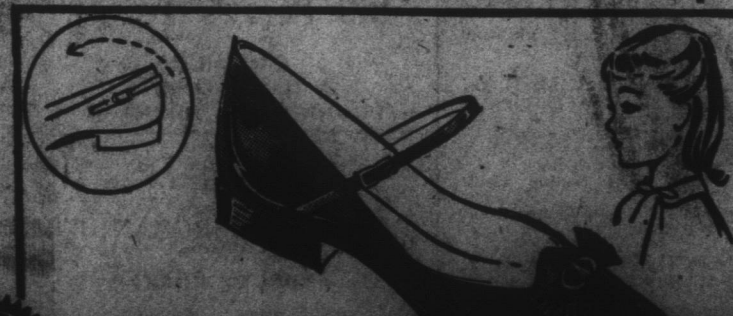
