North Carolina's main plantings are in the Coastal area, with a few being planted in the Mountains.

Blueberry Crop May Become Important

Blueberries — native to North America—are on the move as a cultivated fruit crop. And that's of special importance to North Carolina — which ranks third in U. S. commercial blueberry production acreage. New Jersey and Michigan rank first and second, respectively.

In 1955, an estimated 12,500 acres of cultivated blueberries yielded an estimated \$11 million, marketed fresh, canned and frozen. However, the total value of blueberries in the U. S. is much greater when you add the wild

blueberries harvested.

Melvin H. Koble, horticultural specialist for the N. C. Agricultural Extension Service, says that selection and breeding of superior varieties are enabling growers to put a better product on the market. Hybrids are being developed from some of the large fruit varieties and some of the drought-resistant species which may prove useful in erosion control.

Since different species vary in their climatic requirements, it's possible to grow blueberries from Maine to Florida. A common characteristic of all blueberry varieties, however, is their need for an acid soil. Also, even though

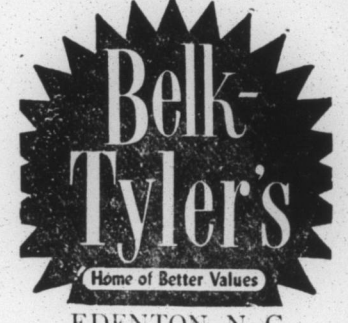
