NEEDFUL OR DESIRABLE?

Recent events have drawn the swerable to nobody. attention of the Congress to the question of whether it is needful or desirable to amend the Constitution of the United States to clarify the somewhat indefinite provisions of article II, section 6, in respect to how the inability of the President to discharge the powers and duties of case a disabling accident or disease deprives him of the capacity to make such determination, and in respect to the ultimate, powers and duties of the Presidential office in case the Presity to discharge them.

No one can gainsay the desirability of clarifying these matters.
