Proposals must be sealed and marked "Street Improvements for the Town of Edenton, N. C." All proposals must be submitted upon the blank forms provided in the copies of proposal, contract and specifications.

Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check for five per cent (5%) of the amount of bid made payable to the Town of Edenton, N. C. In lieu of the 5% certified check, the bidder may offer a bidder's bond in the amount of the 5% of the amount of the bid. All checks must be drawn on a Bank or Trust Company insured under the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

Plans, copies of the Proposal, Contract and Specifications, etc., may be obtained upon application to the Engineer. A set of plans and specifications are on file at the office of the Associated General Contractors, the Town Clerk's office and the office of the Engineer.

The bids for this proposed work will be received at the Town Hall, Edenton, N. C., at which place, and at the time stated above, they will be publicly opened and read.

Consideration will be given only to bids of contractors who submit evidence showing that they are licensed under "An Act to Regulate the Practice of General Contracting," ratified by the General Assembly of North Carolina on March 10, 1925, and so subsequently amended.

A performance bond is required in an amount equal to ten per cent of the contract price, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the contract and upon the payment in full to all persons supplying labor and furnishing materials for and in connection with the construction of the project.

Plans and specifications may be obtained upon application to the Engineer, accompanied by a deposit of Ten Dollars (\$10.00). If a bona fide bid is submitted and plans and specifications returned, one-half of this deposit will be refunded. Where no bid is submitted and/or plans and specifications not returned, no refund will be made.

The Town of Edenton, N. C., reserves the right to increase or diminish the quantities given in the proposal and to award contracts which appear to be for the best interest of the Town. The Town also reserves the right to hold any and all proposals for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days from the date of opening thereof. The Town of Edenton, N. C., also reserves the right to reject any or all bids and waive informalities.

DYNAMITE A-BOMB TRIGGER BLASTS HOUSE—A B-47 bomber accidentally dropped an atomic bomb in the back yard of Walter Gregg's house in Florence, S. C. The A-bomb wasn't fused but the dynamite detonator blasted a crater 35 feet deep and 75 feet across, leveled nearby pine trees like matchsticks and turned farmer Gregg's home into a sagging shell. Gregg and four members of his family were slightly injured. The accident triggered an international uproar about the danger of having planes flying around carrying the nuclear weapons.
