## Spires Not Candidate For Clerk Of Court

Spires came to Edenton in 1921 as manager of the local telephone and telegraph offices, in which capacity he served until his appointment as Clerk, succeeding the late Judge Richard Dillard Dixon, who became a special judge of the Superior Court.

He was Edenton's mayor from 1933 to 1937. During that period, sanitary sewerage lines were laid in North Edenton, the mill village, and many of the cross streets by means of WPA money. Also during that time, the Town sponsored a WPA project for construction of the present armory, as well as considerable street paving.

In 1933 Spires was elected president of the Albemarle Sound Bridge Association, which organization worked in close cooperation with the late Julien Wood, a state highway commissioner, in pressing the fight for a bridge across the Albemarle Sound. These efforts finally achieved suc-

cess, and the bridge was completed in 1937, thus connecting the north and south Albemarle counties.
