

Grandfather Freshman

Californians, who like to boast of their state, were telling some time ago of one of their citizens who has probably hung up a record in adult education.

He graduated from college at the age of one hundred.

North Carolina may have difficulty in matching that. But many of our middle-aged men and women are taking advantage of the opportunity to get a diploma or degree.

One of these is Chowan College's grandfather freshman, Rev. Frank W. Fortesque, Methodist minister and pastor of four churches.

Born on a farm in Hyde County in 1909, Frank Fortesque graduated from the Sladesville High School thirty years ago. About that time his father's health began to fail, and an elder brother was entering Duke Medical School; so the burden of the farm—and of the approaching depression—fell on the younger son. Life was hard for ten years. In 1939—Frank being by that time a married man with four children—the family had only \$500 to live on. But the next years times got better.

In 1946 the Hyde County farmer laid down the plow and became postmaster at the village of Scranton. His new position gave him a chance to study, and to meet people—two things he now regards as providential. "The Lord," he says, "must have been in that change."

His mother, who all along was his counselor, had taught for years the adult Bible class in the Epworth Methodist Sunday School at Sladesville. When failing health compelled her to give up the class, the members persuaded her son to take it. Less than three months later his mother died. "The hardest task I ever had," he says, "was to teach that class on the Sunday after

we laid her body away in the cemetery beside the little church." Four years later the Sunday School made him superintendent. This change brought him rest from the labor of teaching, but brought something else too—a real heartache. He missed the joy of dealing with the great themes of the Bible.

Then one day, toward the end of the winter of '55-'56, his pastor made a request—that he take part in the conference-wide "No Silent Pulpit" campaign which the Methodists were about to put on, in the weeks leading up to Easter. He felt unprepared and unworthy, but he agreed.

As he then spoke in some church, each Sunday of the campaign, Frank Fortesque began to be conscious of a call to the ministry. Last July he laid aside the postal service for the pulpit. He now has a four-church field near Hertford, his charges being Anderson, Bethany, Evans and Center Hill.

Two pleasant surprises Mr. Fortesque records for his freshman year at Chowan. One is his election recently to Phi Theta Kappa, honorary society in junior colleges for high scholarship; the other a gift which "some unnamed angel" made toward his expenses.

The senior member of freshman class, who commutes from his home at Tyner, has had an arduous program for the past nine months, with his four churches and his college career; and he will have an equally strenuous time when his second and final year at Chowan begin in September. But he hopes to hold out.

"Meanwhile," he says, "a wife, four children, a daughter-in-law and two granddaughters will be eagerly awaiting the day when 'Grandpa' gets his diploma."

MILK PRODUCTION UP

Milk production on North Carolina farms during April totaled 151 million pounds, according to the North Carolina Crop Reporting Service. Production for the month is the second largest of record—exceeded only in April, 1957, when 153 million pounds were produced. Milk production per cow in herd on May 1, 1958, averaged 17.5 pounds compared with 18.7 pounds a year earlier. The percent of milk cows milked on May 1, 1958, was 76.0, the same as a year earlier.
