Perhaps no better definition can be found than that given by Thomas Jefferson in his first inaugural address: "A wise and frugal government, which shall restrain men from injuring one another, which shall leave them otherwise free to regulate their own pursuits of industry and inprovement, and shall not take from the mouths of labor the bread it has earned-this is the sum of good government."

One of the first objects of good government is to protect the lives and property of its citizens. All citizens should be left to regulate their own pursuits. They should be left free to improve their property and their businesses. They should be left free to engage in any business which does not injure the person or property of any other citizen.

Good government is such that will not take from the mouths of the labore the bread or the other necessi is of life which ne has earned.

Good government will not take away from the honest toiler and give to the lazy, indolent and careless persons.

Good government will allow the greatest amount of freedom to the individual and the locali-

Good government does not seek to control the masses for the benefit of the few. Good government must not be paternalistic.

In general terms the govern ment that does the least governing is the best government.


