In January he was forced to resign his kingdom to his thirteenyear-old son. He was imprisoned in Kenilworth castle. Next he was given into the charge of two of Mortimer's servants. They carried him from one place if imprisonment to another and heaped on him every indiginity. Then. finding that he did not die of such mistreatment, they murdered him on September 21, 1326.
