Democratic Rally Scheduled Be Held In Ahoskie Oct. 7th

With dates and places designated for Democratic Rallies in each of the 12 Congressional Districts the campaign of the Democratic Party got under way last week in the hope of returning a full Democratic slate to Congress and electing other Democratic officials throughout North Carolina.
