

History Of The American Flag

(Flag Rules Continued)

27. When displayed otherwise than being flown from a staff the U. S. Flag should be suspended so that its folds fall free.

28. Whether hung horizontally or vertically, the stars, or union, should always be in the Flag's own upper right corner, or to the observer's left.

29. The U. S. Flag should never be used as drapery, never festooned, drawn back, nor up, in folds. It should always be allowed to fall free. Bunting should be used for decoration.

30. The Flag should never be fastened, displayed, used or stored in such manner as will permit it to be easily torn, soiled or damaged.

31. The flag should never be used as a ceiling cover.

32. Never hang or grape the flag in any position below the seats on a platform.

33. When used on a speaker's platform, the flag if displayed flat, should be above and behind the speaker. Use bunting to decorate a speaker's desk or the front of the platform.

34. When displayed on a staff in a church chancel, or on a speaker's platform, the U. S. Flag should be to the right of the clergyman or speaker as he faces the congregation or audience. Any other flag should be to his left. If the staffed U. S. Flag is displayed elsewhere than in the chancel or on the platform it should be placed at the right front, and on the floor level with the congregation or audience as they face the chancel or platform. Any other flag should be at the left front.

35. The U. S. Flag should never be used as a receptacle for receiving, holding, carrying or delivering anything.

36. The U. S. Flag should never be placed upon any part of it nor attached to it any mark, insignia, letter, work, figure, design, picture or drawing of any nature.

37. The flag should never be used for advertising purposes. It should not be embroidered on such articles as cushions or handkerchiefs. It should not be printed or otherwise impressed on paper napkins, tablecloths, boxes or anything designed for temporary use and discard. It should never be part of a costume or athletic uniform. Advertising signs should not be fastened to a staff or halyard from which the flag is flown.

38. When the flag is used on a casket its union should be over the deceased's left shoulder. Carry the casket foot first. The flag should not be lowered into the grave, nor allowed to touch the ground.

39. After a U. S. Flag has been used as a casket cover it may, and should be displayed in every normal manner.

40. When the flag is placed upon the grave, see that it will not touch the ground. Do not leave it there indefinitely. In Arlington and other National Cemeteries flags are removed the following day.

41. A U. S. Flag may be mended, washed or dry cleaned. Federal Code and proper usage provide that when the flag is so badly torn, soiled or faded that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display it should be destroyed in a dignified way, privately and preferably by burning.

42. Any rule or custom pertaining to the display of the U. S. Flag may be changed or repealed, or additional rules may be prescribed by the President of the United States, acting as Commander-in-Chief of the armed forces. Any such change shall be set forth in a Presidential proclamation.
