
No. One who is engaged to perate a motor vehicle has no nplied authority, by virtue of is employment, to invite or ermit third persons to ride. It s immaterial that Black was at he particular time delivering nerchandise within the scope of is employment.

Brown was a trespasser upon property owned by White. An owner of property is liable to trespassers for injuries only when they have been willfully and maliciously inflicted by an employee.

An employee does not have an implied authority to invite persons upon vehicles and other property of his employer. The authority to extend invitations must be expressly conferred. The owner of the truck is not required to post a sign on




