#### In High Jaycee Post Higher Yields Estimated to Boost Revenue By \$1,092,700 at Little or No Cost

A program to increase farm income in Chowan County by \$1 million dollars in 1949 was approved by the Chamber of Commerce board of directors at a recent meeting. Gilliam Wood, chairman of the Agriculture Committee, said the board adopted the committee's recommendations for a Chowan County farm improvement program after hearing how farm income can be increased by \$1,092,700 at little or no cost to the average farmer.

Wood said the program is based on obtaining higher yields for crops and livestock now being produced in the county. By folowing soil test and land capability recommendations and conservation practices the average farmer can produce higher in-

Statistics compiled by the committee show, for example, that acre for tobacco was 1,604 pounds. The highest yield according to county records is 2,750 pounds. The committee figures that if each farmer in the county will raise his yield to 1,800 pounds per acre, the county will have an increased dollar income of \$54,-

The committee's statistics for oeanuts show a similar picture The average yield during the last four-year period was 1,790 pounds ncrease the yield to 2,200 pounds they will share a dollar increase of \$251,500 on this crop.
