

Blood Bank Now Hanging In Balance

 "The news we received the other day pertaining to the blood program and other services is not good at all. We were told unless we raise a certain amount of money by July 15, we would lose this program. If any of you have had a member of your family or a friend who was in an accident or had to have surgery and needed whole blood we had this on hand, if not, we got the blood either from Norfolk, Va., or our sub-bank in Windsor, quicker than we can get outside donors. It takes 1 1/2 to 2 hours to type, crossmatch and draw the blood from the donor before you can administer the blood to a patient. By having the blood on hand this could mean a life saved which could be your life or my life. I hope the people of Chowan County will see that we receive enough money to keep this program as well as the other programs in our county.
 "If you would like to make a contribution please mail it to Dr. Archie Walker, Chairman or Gene Ward, treasurer of the Edenton Chapter of the Red Cross or phone them and someone will pick up your contribution. I am asking all of you to give. If everyone would give from 25c to \$1.00 in this county we would have no problem in keeping our blood program as well as the other Red Cross services."

Joe Bass and Ray Smith gave a demonstration on controlling "The Big Three." In their demonstration they showed how to control the three insects which cause the most damage to home gardens of Chowan County. These three insects are the Mexican bean beetle, the cutworm and the cabbage worm.

At this time winners of these various contests will be chosen and as county winners, they will represent Chowan 4-H Club members at the district contest which will be held at the Chowan High School on Wednesday, July 1.

The general public is cordially invited to attend all of the various 4-H activities, both at the county and at the district, according to Robert Marsh, assistant county agricultural agent.
