## Scouts Return From Philmont

Explorers from Tyner Post 154 and the Edenton Post arrived from Philmont Scout Ranch Sunday afternoon, August 23. The four boys who represented the Tyner Post were Tim White, Jackie Ray Ward, Emmett Jones, Jr., and Jimmy Turner.

These boys, along with three from Edenton, Brad Williford, Boots Lassiter and Cecil Fry, went by chartered Carolina Trailways bus and were guests of Army and Navy posts along the way. The trip covered 13 states and approximately 6,000 miles.

At Philmont Scout Ranch each newly arrived group got a medical checkup and then were given primary instruction in examination, foot care, map and compass, burro loading and back packing. Then they boarded a bus for a short trail to a base camp which is the jump-off point for their chosen Philmont adventure.

Along the trail the boys observed wildlife in its natural habitat and at every base camp explorers enjoyed tests of skill around the camp fire.

They also visited the old homes of Pioneer Lucien B. Maxwell and Kit Carson and places of interest along the way.

The boys hiked a distance each day which varied from 3 1/2 miles to 14 miles mostly on a mountainous trail to reach base camps. As well as enjoying the fellowship of fellow Explorers and leaders, each boy earned one or more merit badges.

The Tyner Post is sponsored by the Center Hill Home Demonstration Club and it was partly through the efforts of the sponsoring organization that the Tyner Post had the largest number of boys from any Post in the Albemarle District to go to Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico for this training.
