and helps him to make up his mind whether or not he wants to participate in the 1960 Soil Bank Conservation Reserve Pro-

gram and the probable extent of that participation. Griffin reminded farmers that when they learn their farm maximum rate they will again be required to visit the county office to file a request for a contract. On the second visit to the ASC office the farmer must offer his land for placing in reserve at something less than the maximum rate previously established. The more the farmer reduces his bid below the maximum established, the better his chances of participation. According to Griffin funds available for new contracts in 1960 will be approximately half of what was available in 1959. For this reason farmers who offer their land considerably below the maximum rate will stand a much better chance of having their offers accepted.

Farmers who are interested should not let the September 10 deadline pass without action.

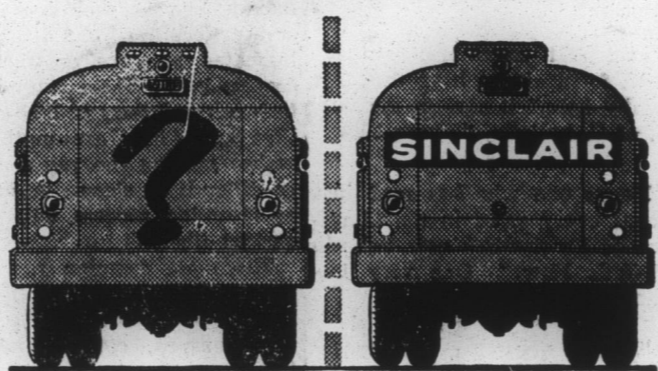
Starting for the winners were Terry Jarborough, Robert Wiley and Thomas Willis.
