

Last week. I noticed several patches of snapbeans being damaged by beetles. The cabbage worm and other insects are busy. Don't feed insects and starve your family. Control the insects and feed your family. But, be careful with insecticides and use them as recommended.

Monday, a lady called me about picking snappeans Wednesday and had dusted them with Toxaphene that day. Toxaphene will control beetles but it is not recommended for snappeans. It, is dangerous. Sevin can be used up to the day before harvest. Malathion can be used up to four days before harvest. Rotenone can be used even on the day of harvest.

You can control insects and have safe vegetables to eat if 3-3:15 - Tree planting. Bill you will only follow recommention if you will only call for it and use it.





spray materials are 50 percen wettable DDT 2 tablespoonfuls per gallon of water, 25 percent emulsifiable Methoxychlor 2 tablespoonfuls per gallon of water, 50 percent wettable Methoxychlor powder 2 tablespoonfuls per gallon of water, wettable Lead Arsenate 3 tablespoonfuls per gallon of water, and 4 percent wettable Rotenone 3 tablespoonfuls per gallon of water.

Do not use DDT or Lead Arsenate on vegetables or fruits, which will be eaten in 30 days. Lead Arsenate may burn the foliage on some tender plants, Methoxychlor may be used on fruits and vegetables up to three days of harvest. Rotenone rust or spray may be used up to harvest.

A Woodland Field Day will be held on Friday afternoon, July 1, at 1 o'clock on the Churchill Farm owned by Carroll and Fahey Byrum. The Churchill Farm is at Evans Church on Highway 32 North. The demonstration will be on the Mavaton Road East.
