**Kennedy Appoints
Herbert Bonner On
Advisory Committee**

Congressman Herbert C. Bonner has been appointed by Senator John F. Kennedy to his Natural Resources Advisory Committee, the Democratic presidential candidate's headquarters in Washington, D. C., has announced.

"I am particularly glad to have Herbert Bonner on this committee, because of his special interest in water and conservation problems," Senator Kennedy said.

The Committee will have an important role in the campaign clarifying the issues in this field, which has been retarded and neglected by the Eisenhower administration. The committee will make the recommendations for an action policy on natural resources for my administration."

Representative Bonner said he had discussed the water and conservation problems of North Carolina with Senator Kennedy.

"We are both convinced," Congressman Bonner said, "that real progress can be made toward their solution under his administration through sound investment in our natural resources. I am pleased to serve on the committee, not only to help point up this issue during the campaign, but in order to help determine the policy of the new administration."
