Carolina Department of Conservation & Development officials and a number of out-of-state visitors will be present at the ribbon-cutting ceremonies to be held at the plant Thursday morning.

Governor-elect Terry Sanford has been invited and if no conflicting engagement of state business interferes at the last minute, will be present at the main address. Governor Luther Hodges has expressed his regrets saying a previous engagement will take him to Chapel Hill that day and wishing the Seabrook Blanching Corporation continued success in their worldwide operations.

The Seabrook plant's official opening Thursday will highlight activities of Industry Appreciation Week, a state-wide observance and tribute to the economic contributions of industry and is co-sponsored in Chowan County by the Board of County Commissioners and the Edenton Chamber of Commerce. Guided tours will be conducted by the Seabrook management during the day.

The fame of Seabrook's water blanching process for peanuts has spread around the world. Already the National Nut Company of Canada near Toronto and the South African Alderton Ltd. of Randfontein, South Africa, are producing water blanched peanuts for distribution in their corners of the globe in their franchise granted them by the Seabrook firm and using machinery and equipment made at Tyrone, Pa., headquarters of the Corporation.

A French manufacturer at

Strasbourg in Alsace is another to use the patented process for custom blanching peanuts. Negotiations are currently under way to install water blanching machinery for a peanut processing firm in England.

The general manager of the new plant is Keith J. Reeve of 117 W. Church St., Edenton. Reeve is secretary of Seabrook Blanching Corp., a son-in-law of James W. Gardner of Hillcrest, Tyrone, Pa., president of the firm.

The original Mill Village consisted of ten 3-room, one 5-room, one 6-room and one 7-room dwellings; today the village has grown to a total of 75 houses with its own well attended church, the First Christian Church, the Rev. E. C. Alexander, minister.

The production of the Edenton Cotton Mills is distributed as far west as Oregon, as far north as Maine and south to Alabama. The yarn manufactured by Edenton Cotton Mills is used in a variety of trades, among which is the insulation of wires and cables which are used in automobiles; lace curtains, lace tablecloths, velours, plushes, braids, tapestries, webbing, venetian blind tapes, automobile trimmings, cravats for

the armed services, hair cloth and rugs. This varied production of the Edenton Cotton Mills accounts for an annual payroll distributed in Edenton of from \$555,000 to \$600,000.

A dividend for employees in addition to the payroll is the very nominal rent of the Mill Village dwellings, hospitalization and life insurance benefits.

An additional contribution to the economic life of the community and the area by Edenton Cotton Mills is found in the gainful employment of farmers who grow the cotton, the trucks and railroads who supply the transportation, the power that turns the spindles, the spare parts for the machinery and the other materials of upkeep and maintenance of this modern facility.

Stock in the Edenton Cotton Mills has always been owned largely by local people. It's their industry, it's the community's industry and the county's and it is proper that now, during "Industry Appreciation Week", we pay tribute to the Edenton Cotton Mills and to those who had the foresight and the energy to establish it.

Present officers of the Edenton Cotton Mills are P. S. McMullan, president and treasurer; Dr. Frank Wood, vice president;

C. A. Phillips, vice president and R. F. Elliott, secretary and assistant treasurer.

Guided tours through the mill for the general public have been arranged by the management starting at 2, 3 and 4 P. M., Thursday, December 1.


