



Washington — President Kennedy, at a recent press conference, restated his Senatorial position that he was opposed to federal aid to parochial schools. This is a matter that may be soon debated in the Senate. I should like to state the grounds upon which I join with the President in opposing parochial school aid. The ancestors of most Americans came to this country in order to enjoy religious freedom, which they clearly believed embraced the right not to pay taxes for the direct or indirect teaching of religious doctrines which they disbelieved.

Statute of Religious Freedom—Their attitude was clearly reflected in the Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom. That Statute declares "that to compel a man to furnish contributions of money for the propagation of opinions which he disbelieves is sinful and tyrannical."

Controversy—The controversy over aid to parochial schools has been touched off by some Catholic leaders who have called for the inclusion of parochial and private schools in any federal aid program for education. There can be no doubt of the fact that parochial schools constitute institutions of the Catholic Church and teach its tenets and faith.

First Amendment—The First Amendment to the Constitution of the United States declares that "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment
