

### Change Made In Planting Tobacco

Tobacco intertilled with any other crop will be considered as being all tobacco for ASC measuring purposes, unless the distance between the rows or strips of tobacco is at least four normal tobacco rows. This, according to A. C. Griffin, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation County Chairman, is a very significant change and one which all tobacco farmers should remember when they set tobacco. The same thing applies if tobacco is planted in alternate rows or strips with idle land—except for eligible sled rows.

Griffin further explained that eligible sled rows may be deducted from the acreage of flue-cured tobacco provided no crop is planted in the sled row. If a row is planted in the sled row it will be counted as all tobacco.

If because tobacco is planted with other crops or idle land the entire acreage must be considered as tobacco, no credit for disposition of excess acreage may be given for any area not planted to tobacco unless the area destroyed is as wide as four normal rows. By the same token according to Griffin, if a crop planted in a sled row is destroyed the area still would not be eligible for deduction and no disposition credit could be given.

### Schoolmasters' Club Mourns Holmes Loss

Nathan H. Yelton, executive secretary of the Teachers' and State Employees' Retirement System of North Carolina, said

at Creswell before one of the largest crowds ever to be present for an Albemarle Schoolmasters Club meeting. One hundred and sixty teachers, principals, superintendents and guests attended the event in the new Creswell High School cafeteria.

Washington County Superintendent of Schools Roy F. Lowry, introduced the speaker and recognized the guests. Among the guests present were Miss Francis Kornegay of the Division of School Health, D. W. Jones, Pupil Accounting Supervisor for the State Board of Education, P. B. Belanga, a member of the Washington County Board of Education and S. P. Cross, chairman of the Gates County Board of Education.

The Rev. Mark Woolard, accompanied by his wife, entertained the group with musical selections.

T. A. Hood, president of the club and principal of the Camden County High School, presided at the business session. The following resolution was presented by R. F. Lowry, seconded by John T. Biggers, superintendent of Perquimans County Schools, and unanimously carried:

1. Mourns the loss of John A. Holmes who served as superintendent of the Edenton City Schools for thirty-eight years.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Councilmen of the Town of Edenton, that in accordance with the General Laws of the State of North Carolina, and the Charter of the Town of Edenton, the Board of Councilmen hereby call for an election to be held in the Town of Edenton on Tuesday, May 2, 1961, the same being the first Tuesday after the

first Monday in May, the date established by the law for said election. Said election shall be conducted for the purpose of electing a Mayor and six Councilmen, one Councilman to be elected from each ward of the Town of Edenton and two to be elected by the Town at large, a Treasurer, and five members of the Board of Public Works by the voters of the Town. The Mayor, each Councilman, the Treasurer and each member of the Board of Public Works shall be elected to hold office for a term of two years, and until their successors are elected and qualified.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Chowan County Board of Elections is hereby directed to conduct said election in accordance with Chapter 160-29 of the General Statutes of North Carolina and the Charter of the Town of Edenton as amended.

Motion was made by George A. Byrum, seconded by Luther C. Parks, and duly carried that James Stillman and William C. Crumney be granted a refund in 1960 taxes for taxes collected in error, in the amount of \$4.50 and \$4.00 respectively.
