Under the plan being effectuated by Mr. Bonner, the cost to the State will be only onefourth of the total cost of the bridge, the remaining threefourths being paid by the Government. Of the Government's share, two-thirds will be paid by the Bureau of Public Roads, and one-third by the Depart ment of the Interior.

The National Seashore Park, which was brought into existence primarily through the efforts of Mr. Bonner, has proven so successful that five other similar parks are now being planned in various parts of the United States-the first of these at Cape Cod, Mass., is presently under development and will be followed by other seashore recreational areas on the other three coasts of the United States.
