

### KNOW YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY

John T. Grooms, representative of the Social Security Administration, is in Edenton every Thursday at the North Carolina Employment Security Commission office in the Citizens Bank Building.

When you change your address, you wouldn't think of carrying the same old house key along after you have made the change in residence, would you? Yet, according to Mr. John T. Grooms, Field Representative of the Norfolk, Va., Social Security District Office, there are some married women who still carry the same old Social Security cards they had before they were wed. Some fail to make the changes months, or even years, after they have changed their names from Miss to Mrs.

The key to your Social Security record is your Social Security account number card. No one should have more than one Social Security number, yet it is possible to have more than one card under different names. In the interest of having all earnings properly credited to the proper account number, the Social Security Administration needs to know about changes in names whether it be because of marriage, divorce or other reasons. Women who marry and fail to report this change may experience delay when it is time to figure the Social Security benefits due them.

The fifth stop for the touring group will be in the Advance community at the R. C. Holland farm. Arrival time is scheduled for 5:15 P. M. C. W. Overman,

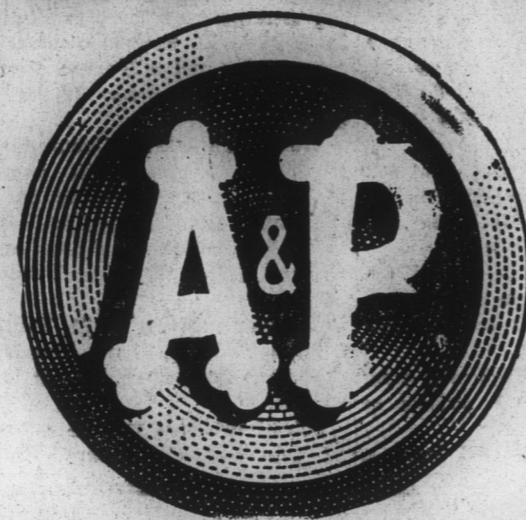
