### Town Council Proceedings

Edenton, N. C. Sept. 12, 1961.

The Town Council met this day in regular session at 8:00 P. M.

Members present: Mayor John A. Mitchener, Jr., J. E. Bufflap, George A. Byrum, Luther C. Parks, C. A. Phillips, R. Elton Forehand and R. D. Dixon, Jr.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mitchener and George A. Byrum gave the invocation.

Herbert W. Taylor, Emmett Ingram and Major Walter Beale appeared on behalf of the North Carolina Army National Guard in regards to the lease of the firing range. The Council agreed to change the lease to 5 years with a 90 day cancellation clause with the Town paying a prorata share of the cost of permanent improvements (not to exceed \$3,500.00) if the Town should have to invoke the cancellation clause within the first three years.

Motion was made by R. D. Dixon, Jr., seconded by R. Elton Forehand and duly carried that the following ordinance be adopted:

An ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$543,000 of bonds of the Town of Edenton for the enlargement and extension of the sanitary sewer system of the Town of Edenton.

Motion was made by R. Elton Forehand, seconded by R. D. Dixon, Jr., and duly carried that the recommendation of the E & W Board to establish a sewer charge to finance the proposed bonds to construct sewage disposal facilities, be accepted.

In order to facilitate the electric and water billing system it was unanimously agreed to move the billing department to the E & W Department.
