

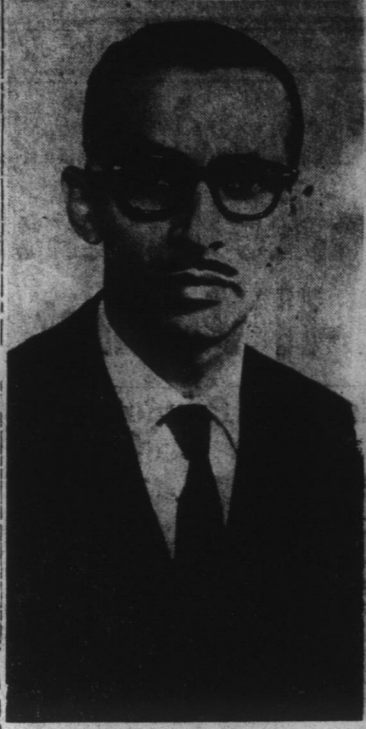
Center Hill Group Sponsors Chicken Supper On Feb. 3

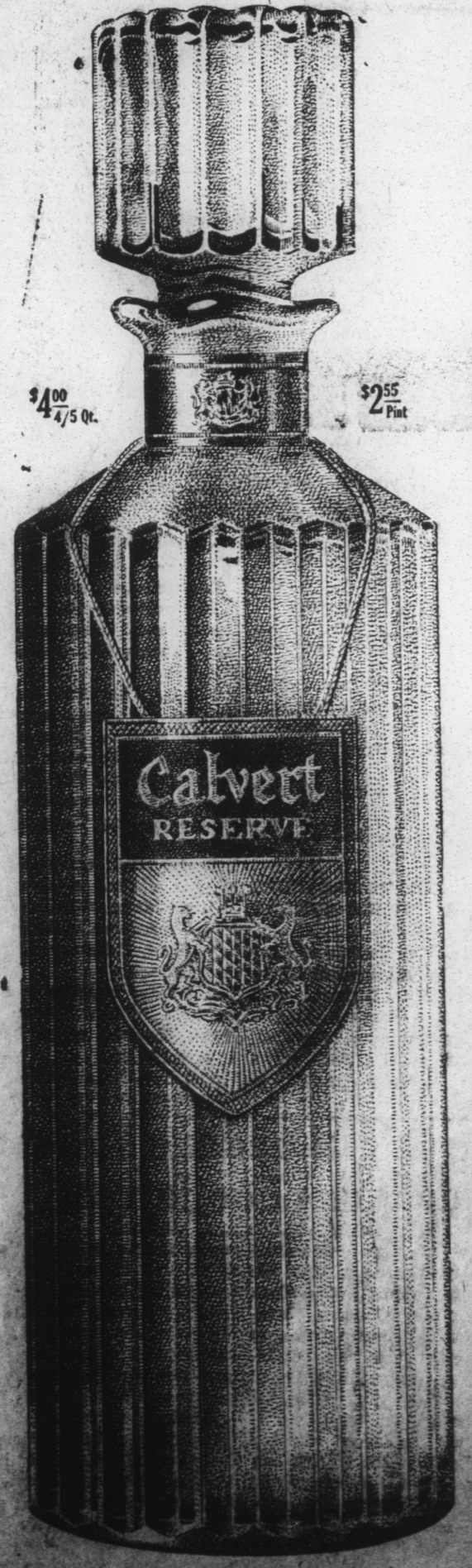
