

AROUND THE FARMS IN CHOWAN COUNTY

Area Development Selects Three Agricultural Areas For Concentration: The Agricultural Committee of the Albemarle Area Development Association met at Swan Quarter on January 18 with representative members from most of the Albemarle counties attending. Attending this meeting from Chowan County were Woodrow Lowe and C. W. Overman. The meeting was principally devoted to a discussion of how the agricultural income of the area might be increased.

Consideration was given to the possibility of establishing processing plants for agricultural commodities. Marketing methods need to be improved in some instances. The production of new commodities was considered. The committee also discussed ways and means of more efficient production with commodities we are presently producing.

Extension Specialist Robert Long suggested that we make a poll of the counties present to determine the agricultural areas affecting most of the counties relative to increased income. The poll taking was based on the agricultural income plans prepared in each county by the agricultural or extension advisory boards. Swine, beef cattle and vegetables were the three areas in which every county had indicated a plan for increased income. These are the three areas the committee selected to concentrate on in the next five years.

It was agreed that each Board member would select a person as chairman of swine, a chairman of beef cattle and a chairman of vegetables in each of the ten counties. These commodity committees would meet with Extension Specialists and prepare the program action plan. This meeting is scheduled to be held at the Ball Room of the Joseph Hewes Hotel Building in Edenton on Thursday morning, February 1, at 10 o'clock. Details of the prepared plans will be publicized as soon as available.

When the agricultural income plan for the Albemarle area is developed, its usefulness will depend upon the efforts of the farm people and others in the area. If we really want to increase the income on every farm, then it is necessary that every farm family work toward that goal in a systematic way. I trust that we will make use of this combined effort because we have excellent opportunities.

Joint Community Meetings Are Scheduled For February: The annual joint community meetings in Chowan County will be held during the month of February as usual. "Wills and Inheritance Laws" will be the program topic.

The agricultural and home economics agents have received training on the subject through Extension Specialist Katherine Riggie. We will be able to get a local lawyer representative to attend some of the meetings. We feel that we will be in a position to give the people sufficient information so that they will have a better understanding of the need for making wills so that they will be sufficiently interested to contact their legal counsel for more details.

According to the present schedule, most of the meetings will be dinner meetings held at the community center around 6 to 6:30 o'clock. The schedule for next week is Advance on Monday night, Oak Grove on Tuesday night, and Ryland on Thursday night. Readers will also note a more complete schedule elsewhere in this paper.
