Sunday School Lesson

NO STEALING

International Sunday School Lesson for March 4, 1962.

Memory Selection: "Let the thief no longer steal, but rather let him labor, doing honest work with his hands, so that he may be able to give to those in need." (Ephesians 4:28).

Lesson Text: Exodus 20:15; Joshua 7:19-26; Matthew 22:15-22; Mark 11:15-19; Luke 19:11-27.

In examining the last six Commandments in order to help Christians discover the eternal principles underlying a Christian's relationships with his fellow men, the purpose of our study today is to discuss some of the reasons why people steal from others, from their society, and from God, and to make a strong case for honesty as one of the fundamental Christian virtues.

"Thou shalt not steal," is the eighth Commandment. And it is broken more often than we care to admit. We do not always render unto Caesar that which is Caesar's!

Many well-meaning men and women are victimized into believing that the complexity of our current-day life, inflationary prices, and competition for recognition made it difficult, if not impossible, to succeed without cheating. We would like to believe that men universally prize their integrity. Upon nothing else in life do we place a higher premium. But stealing, in one form or another, goes on almost constantly. Why? First, there is a minority group in any society which is chronically diseased . . . the kleptomaniacs. They are sick, and they cannot help themselves. Appealing to their conscience and will is a waste of breath. Their promises are made in good faith, but their resistance to the temptation to steal is negligible. Others steal so they can gain prestige. How often has an embezzler used his ill-gotten funds to build up his reputation as a philanthropist or a benefactor? If he is an outgoing person, he basks in the warmth of adulation; if he is an introvert, he simply settles for inner personal satisfaction. And the man who boasts that he can collect a full eight-hours' pay

'61 Extension Work Report In Chowan

(continued from last week)

Fifth Installment

Six communities were organized in community development groups during the year. Short and long term goals were set up in each of the communities including concentrated work with youth and youth activities and young adult leadership, building new and improving existing community buildings and grounds, church activities and participation, garbage disposals, increased income, soil testing, home improvements and roadside beautification.

Four hundred and nine families cooperated and/or participated in community development. Local officers, committees for Increased Income, Home Improvement, Community Projects and Youth for each group accomplished many of the short term goals and have made much progress on many of the long term goals during the year.

A total of 82 persons helped tell the story of what was done in their respective communities to the judges as they visited each of the communities. One hundred and seventy-five persons attended the fourth annual awards program. Awards were made with premiums as follows, without producing eight hours of honest work, is very common—not not much nobler! The student who takes advantage of the honor system and cheats on an examination is a thief, too.

Still others steal for the sole Ryland, grand champion, receiving \$109.32; Enterprise and Center Hill, blue ribbon, receiving \$72.88 each; Rocky Hook and Advance, red ribbon, receiving \$36.44 each; Cross Roads, white ribbon, receiving \$18.22. Center Hill received \$10.00 attendance prize. This contest is sponsored by the Chowan County Agricultural Workers' Council. Peoples Bank and Trust Company of Edenton donates the premium money and Albemarle Electric Membership Corporation gives the door prizes.

In September, 1961, the Albemarle Area Development Association was formed with Chowan County as one of the ten counties included. Area Development includes Industry, Agriculture, Travel - Recreation and Community Development. The County Area Development Association consists of R. S. Atkinson, chairman, and Mrs. E. N. Elliott, serving three-year terms; Shelton Moore and Eugene Jordan, serving two-year terms; Mrs. J. C. Boyce and Jim Robinson, serving one-year terms. Committee members include Industry, W. J. Jones, chairman; Agriculture, Woodrow Lowe, chairman; Travel - Recreation,
