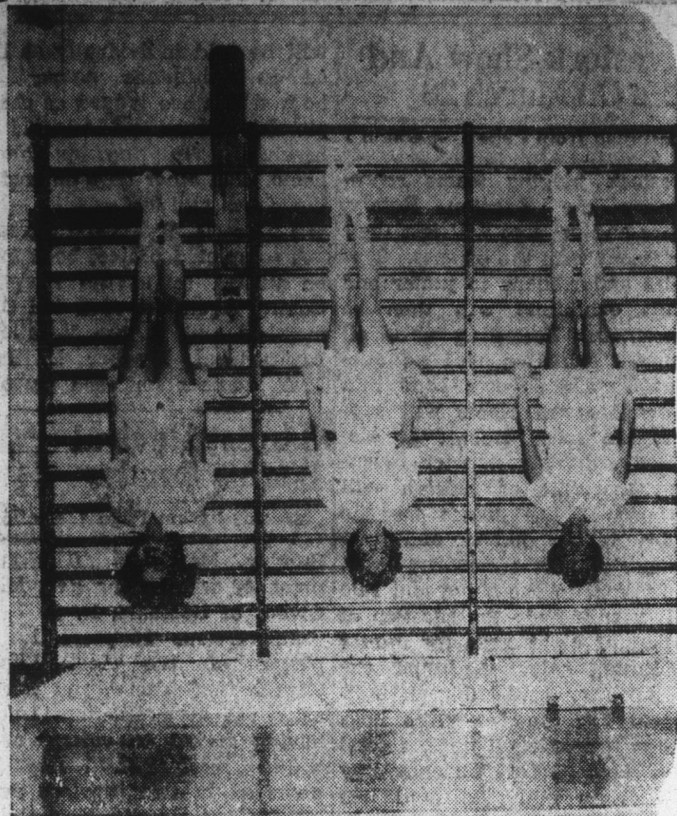

fishing for shad would be set at May 1st, herring would be excluded and the closing date for the inland waters would be set by the Wildlife Resources Com-

mission at June 5. Four of the five members of the Commercial Fisheries Committee were present at the meeting and agreed unanimously to make these recommendations to the Commercial Fisheries Liaison Committee also took under advisement a list of boundary line changes between commercial and sports fishing waters which was submitted by the Wildlife Resources Commission and promised to have an answer as soon as the matter could be closely studied by staff members. It is probable that the recommendations on these boundary line changes will be completed by the time of the full C&D Board meeting at New Bern on April 2.

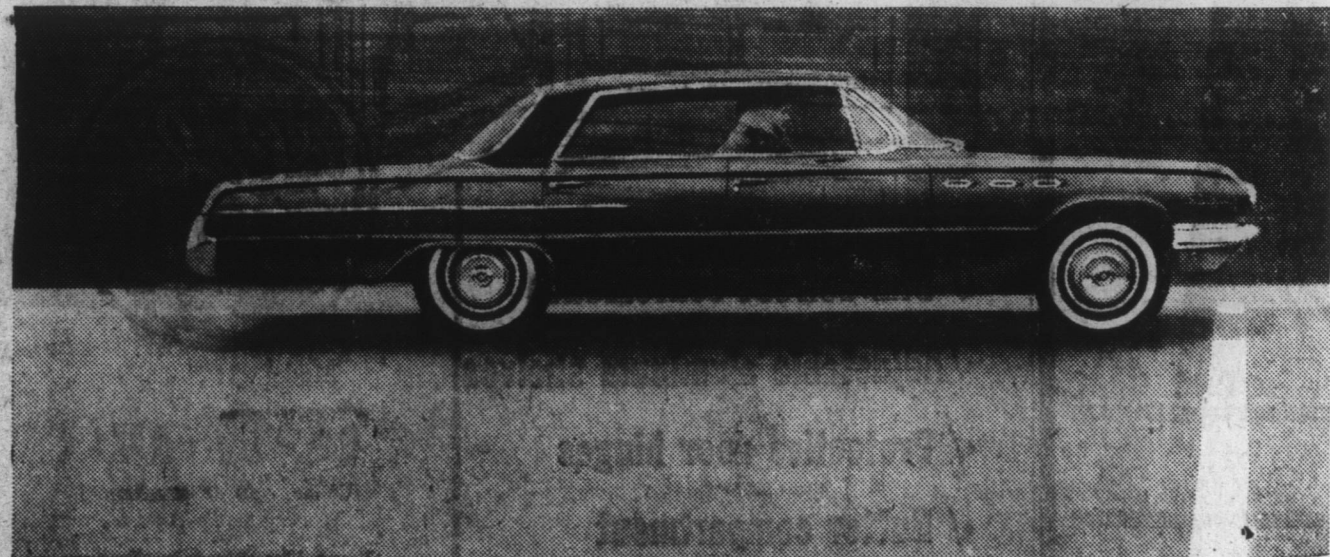
