**THE GREATEST COMMANDMENT**

International Sunday School Lesson for March 25, 1962.

Memory Selection: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." (Luke 10:27)

Lesson Text: Deuteronomy 6:4-5; Leviticus 19:18; Matthew 22:35-40; 19:16-22; Luke 10:25-37.

## SCHOOL AND YOUR CHILD

**Should Parents See School Records on Pupils?**

Most schools keep careful records on pupils, including such information as scores on intelligence and achievement tests, marks made in each grade, and teacher comments on ability. In some cases the school psychologist's report on emotional stability is part of the "cumulative records."

Should these records be shown to parents?

Educators long have been reluctant to do so out of fear that parents may misunderstand the information and their children possibly suffer as a consequence. For instance, a proud mother, on finding Junior's IQ to be a high 136, may boast of the score at a bridge party. That's fine for her ego. But how does the mama across the table feel who knows her child's score to be a low 85?

In either case, the IQ for a number of reasons, could be inaccurate.

Despite this and other disadvantages of showing official school records on pupils to parents, there appears to be a trend toward revealing the information when requested.

New York State Commissioner of Education James E. Allen last summer ruled that "official school records—but not working papers such as notes, psychological reports, and reports from social agencies and juvenile courts—are to be shown on request to parents of New York children."

The ruling clarified an issue that arose when a parent sued to get psychiatric reports on his seventh-grade son.

In making records available, however, officials should see to it that they're understandable and appropriately interpreted to parents, says Bruce E. Shear, director of pupil personnel services for the New York State Education Department.

Proper interpretation is a must, according to Shear.

"The casual reading of a score on a standardized test without thorough knowledge of the test, the purpose for which it was used . . . can be worse than useless," a New York advisory committee on pupil records told Commissioner Allen.

Henry Chauncey, president of Educational Testing Service, Princeton, N. J., which administers tests to millions of American students, suggests that schools as a matter of policy reveal to parents such information as how Junior scored on his intelligence tests.

This is what the Jackson, Mich., school system does.

Each year the administration informs parents by letter of the scores made by their children on standardized tests of ability and achievement.

The scores, given in percentages, tells each mother and father how Junior or Janie would stand in a particular test in an average group of 100 students.

W. G. Katzenmeyer, Jackson's director of pupil services, explains it this way:

"If your child's score is at the 60th percentile, it might be
