

Negro Annual Northeastern Hog Show And Sale March 29

Fletcher E. Lassiter, County Negro agricultural agent, announces that the third annual Northeastern North Carolina Market Hog Show and Sale will be held in Windsor on March 29. The show and sale will be held at the Carolina-Virginia Stockyard. Swine producers in the following counties may participate: Bertie, Beaufort, Chowan, Gates, Hertford, Martin, Northampton, Pasquotank and Perquimans.

All barrows and gilts entered for show and sale must be between the weights of 180-220 pounds. Animals weighing less than 180 or more than 220 pounds will not be auctioned off but sold in the open market at the current market prices.

Hogs may be entered in all of the following classifications:

A—Single Classes

1. One barrow or gilt weighing between 180-200 lbs.
2. One barrow or gilt weighing between 201-220 lbs.

B—Pen Classes

1. Pen of 3 barrows and/or 200 lbs.
2. Pen of 3 barrows and/or gilts weighing between 201-220 lbs.

There will be an adult and a youth division in both of the above classes.

Awards will be given to owners exhibiting the Grand Champion single pen and pen of 3's. A swine judging contest will be held for the youth. Any boy or girl between the ages of 10 and 21 years enrolled in NEFA or 4-H Club work is eligible to participate in the contest as a team. Four boys and/or girls will make up a team. Three will serve as members of the team and one alternate. Awards will be given first place team.

Even if anyone is not entering hogs for show and sale, he should be greatly benefitted by attending. "Plan now to attend," says County Agent Fletcher, "and if you should have any questions concerning the show and sale please feel free to call on me."

Chowan Tribe No. 12, Improved Order of Red Men, will meet Monday night at 7:30 o'clock.

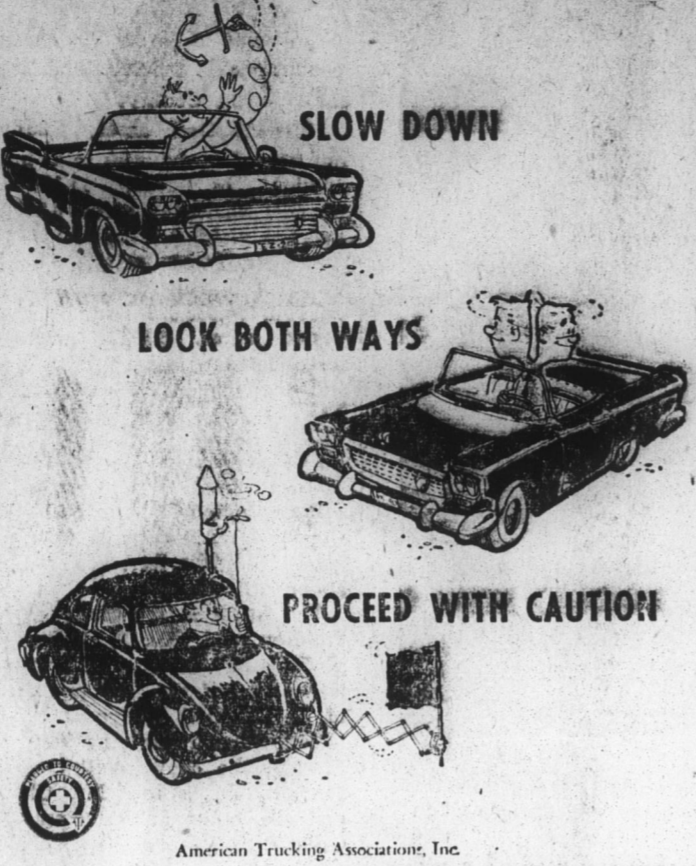
Friday, March 23, is final date for farmers to release unused cotton acreage in order to protect cotton allotments.

Health For All

Marilyn is a pretty, young woman, very much in love with her fiance. But her family doesn't think she should marry. "You can't, Marilyn! With tuberculosis, you can't take a chance."

It's true that Marilyn has had TB for a year. She spent the first six months in the hospital and is still under medical care at home. It will be at least a year before she is completely well. But she's a good patient, making fine progress.

Can she live a normal life? Can she marry and have a family?

The answers must come from her doctor. But chances are good that he will say, "Yes!"

Today's evidence shows that pregnancy has no effect on the mother's disease. It does not cure TB, nor does it make the illness worse. This information comes from a specialist on the subject. Dr. J. Arthur Myers has treated over four hundred mothers with tuberculosis and has examined their 872 children.

The thing for Marilyn to do is to discuss the matter with her doctor. If she gives his blessings to her marriage, she will have to see him regularly, just as she would if she were single. Her family members—including her husband—will have to get regular skin tests.

Just to make sure they don't have TB.

If Marilyn (with her doctor's approval) has a baby, she may nurse and care for him—if the doctor says she is no longer infectious. There is no reason why her TB history need interfere with a happy marriage and motherhood.

Children are not born with TB nor do they inherit it. They can catch it from the mother if her disease is active. But only if modern preventive measures are not carefully followed.

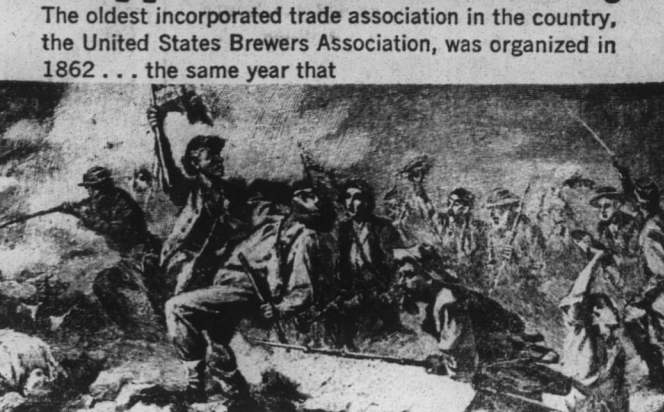
Sgt. Cedric Basnight Is Expert Marksman

M-Sgt. Cedric W. Basnight, 37, son of Mr. and Mrs. Benjamin F. Basnight of Edenton, recently achieved recognition as a top Army marksman by qualifying for the expert marksmanship badge during range firing with the Army's new M-14 rifle in Germany.

The M-14 will replace the M-1 rifle, carbine, Browning automatic rifle and M13 submachine gun. It packs the fire power of a light machinegun, can be fired both automatically and semiautomatically and fires the standard 7.62-millimeter NATO cartridge.

Basnight, an operations sergeant in the 26th Artillery's Headquarters and Service Battery in Germany, entered the Army in 1942 and arrived overseas on this tour of duty in May 1959.
