Mrs. Twiddy urges all residents of Edenton to give generously to the Crusade to make it the best in history.

"The progress made in cancer control depends on the amount of money invested in the program to fight it," said Mrs. Twiddy. "Your contribution is one of the greatest investments in the world to eliminate a disease which at present rates will strike 45 million Americans now living. Let us give more, to cure more."

Of the funds raised during the Crusade, 40% remains in Chowan County.

She said "education of good citizenship is the main purpose of the national society's committee on DAR Good Citizens. Its values are self evident: if we do not have good citizenship, we do not have good government. Our historic traditions are an incentive for good citizenship today and a guide for future stability and progress."

State Senator Irvin Belk addressed the members of "Patriotism." He said "there is much confusion about patriotism—Loyalty to one's country is far more than using flags, celebrating national holidays or declaring loyalty to the Constitution. A person who is loyal does not have to give up the right of criticism when he believes a wrong decision is about to be made. He can be loyal to what he things his country ought to be as well as loyal to what it is. The only way we can preserve a representative gov-

ernment is to recognize that a decision of the majority is a decision for all."

Mrs. Charles W. Tillett, U. S. representative to the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women and a member of the U. S. delegation to the UN General Assembly, in a speech at the opening night banquet, said, "To be trained to lead, to be able to lead and to be unwilling to lead is the unpardonable sin of democracy."

"There may have been a time when a patriotic American woman could confine her interest to the boundaries of her state or her region of her country," she said, "but today, if an American woman lays claim to patriotism, she must widen her horizon and become a citizen of the world."

During the banquet Mrs. Norman Cordon, state regent presided and her husband sang the DAR hymn, written by Mrs. J. Kenneth Pfohl and Mrs. Gertrude S. Carraway.

Over 250 delegates attended the conference, which began Tuesday and concluded Thursday.

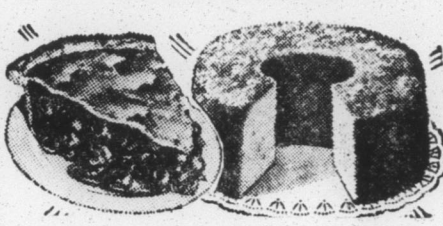
