Disarmament Conference The 17-nation Geneva Disarmament Conference currently under way demonstrates once again the vast Love is at the helm of thought, hol. difficulties which lie in the pursuit of peace, a problem which has plagued mankind since the dawn of history. World statesmen are academically agreed that the nations of the world ought to strive for universal peace. From that point forward, however, the problem ranges the spectrum of mankind's frictions. For one thing, disarmament depends upon an inviolable agreement among nations to settle disputes without resort to war That problem involves safeguards in the modern world not only against nuclear and space weapons, but germ warfare, poison gas, and a host of weapons that might turn nature against mankind or a nation it possessed by an unfriendly power. History records the attempts that have been made before. The czar of Russia in 1890 proposed disarmament through international agreement. The constitution of the old League of Nations contained twenty-six articles specifying the peace treaties drawn at the Paris Conference at the close of World War I. The present United Nations has a Security Council of which Russia is a member which theoretically has the main responsibility for maintaining world peace. Under the Security Council of the United Nations are committees which are to advise on the control of armaments and to bring about a measure of disarmament. The nations of the earth have




