personal representative of the Legion's National Commander. This national committee seeks the organization of community committees throughout the United States to join in this nationwide demonstration of national unity.

In announcing Adm. Burke's appointment, National Commander Bacon said, "We have been told by Nikita Khrushchev that the freedom born July 4, 1776, is inevitably to be buried. I cannot believe that America will permit freedom to die, either by slow decay or by thermonuclear holocaust. However, I do believe that there is need for the entire world to understand and to correctly assess America's commitment to freedom. Unless we can convince foreign governments that we mean what we say, that we cherish liberty as greatly today as did the founders of this nation, we take the terrible risk of war by miscalculation."

The National Commander of the American Legion therefore urges the ringing of bells across the nation to give further emphasis of America's declaration of unity.
