loans for real estate purposes may be extended over a period of up to 20 years.

Any established farm owner or farm operator in Chowan County desiring further information about these loans or other types of assistance available through the Farmers Home Administration may contact Mr. Norman on Monday, Wednesday and Friday of each week.

Robert B. Horning, Charlotte branch manager of the Small Business Administration, announces that Chowan County makes a total of 21 Eastern North Carolina counties which have been designated because of substantial damage and loss as a result of excessive rainfall.

Any small business concern located in the counties designated is eligible for consideration for an SBA disaster loan provided it can show substantial economic injury resulting from the excessive rainfall. Farmers and stockmen are not eligible for financial assistance from SBA under this program, but

instead should apply to the Farmers Home Administration. The authority to accept applications under this program will expire December 31, 1963. Application for assistance under the business disaster loan program may be addressed to: Small Business Administration, 1109 Independence Building, Charlotte 2, N. C.

Several Growers Of Peanuts Overplanted

"We have several peanut producers that have excess peanuts planted and have indicated that they intend to hog the excess," stated H. O. West, local ASC office manager, this week.

"Most of these producers plan to measure the excess acreage themselves and have paid for only one trip to the farm for checking this acreage. These producers are cautioned to be sure to leave out enough acreage to take care of the excess. If the peanuts are plowed up in excess of allotment, they will be considered harvested and the producer will be issued a penalty card. If you have excess peanuts, please pay particular attention to this notice."

Mr. West also stated that tobacco marketing cards have been prepared and can be picked up at the office, if needed, before August 15.


