youngsters. Even President Kennedy has given up touch football for golf. Duncan, a star high school, college, and professional footballer before becoming Appalachian's coach, wouldn't deem competitive team sports. He thinks they have a definite and valuable role in an over-all school program.

But most youngsters who aren't skilled enough to make the big team should be taught more individual sports in school. Duncan suggests a tremendous expansion in the teaching of tennis, golf, handball, bowling, swimming, tumbling, wrestling, table tennis and croquet. Not only are such sports a lifetime source of enjoyment, they can be a real factor in maintaining healthful vigor throughout life. Regular physical activity is a must for good health, Duncan said.

TIDINGS OF COMFORT AND JOY International Sunday School Lesson for August 26, 1962. Memory Selection: "How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good tidings, who publishes peace..." (Isaiah 52:7)

Today's lesson is the last in a unit on "A People Uprooted." In our endeavor to help adults recognize that God's steadfast love has power to sustain individuals and nations, the question we example today is: In what way does our experience of redemption lead us to proclaim tidings of comfort and joy? The Bible material for this lesson is essentially the announcement of good news. Individual Sports Express Manhood A boy may never let on, but his physique is terribly important to him and greatly influences the way he acts.

No matter how frail, flabby, or weak he is, every Junior craves to appear masculine. It's the nature of the gender. Why else does Terzan thump his chest or the rooster crow?

How a youngster goes about expressing his manhood, both to himself and others, can be done in many ways—some good, some bad.

Highly acceptable is playing on school athletic teams, the goal of practically every male youth, but positions on baseball, football, or other squads are limited in number.

What about the big majority of youngsters who can't make a team? Will the passive alternative of sitting and cheering in the stands satisfy masculine egos?

Not quite. Many compensate. Some drive hot-rod cars like mad. Many act tough in school. A few begin smoking, drinking. Others may enter into the more acceptable intellectual periphery—become bookwormish.

None of these outlets, however, really satisfies a boy's basic urge for appearing manly. What the
