### Sanford To Visit Chowan Schools

Mr. Mayo will preside at the assemblies and the school bands will play before and after the governor's addresses. According to Superintendent of County Schools W. J. Taylor, the Governor will address the students at Chowan High School. Mr. Wood is again expected to introduce Sanford.

Platform guests at the county schools will be the county commissioners, members of the county school board, and both county legislators. Due to the lack of space in Chowan High School's auditorium, the public will not be invited.

Governor Sanford will arrive in Currituck County on September 4, four schools there, dedicate the ferry, and then go to Elizabeth City for a visit to the Hayes Corp. plant. After spending the night in Elizabeth City, Sanford will tour Pasquotank and Perquimans schools before coming to Chowan.

The governor will return to Raleigh after the White Oak visit. The visit will be sponsored by the North Carolina Committee for Better Schools in the Albemarle area, and is a resumption of Sanford's efforts to build increased public awareness and support of progress needed in the public schools.

The local visit will be the first held during the new school year. Sanford plans to visit schools in each county during his administration.
