The 40th annual convention of the Northeastern District of the North Carolina Education Association meets in Rocky Mount Tuesday, October 23.

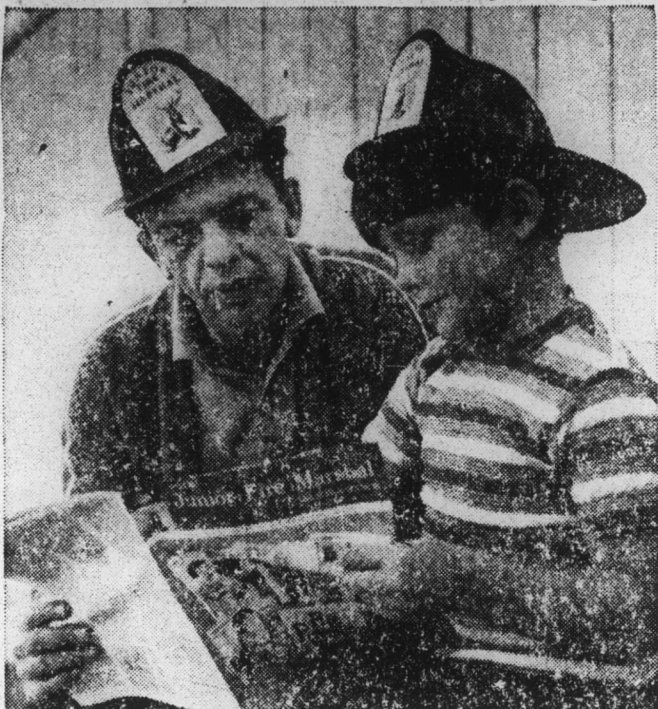
